


Here's how it works: You'll have to read the map below, choose a location that is currently

What are some other things to know about Cunnamulla

When you are in Cunnamulla you should do the Charlotte Plains, Aldville Station, artesian mud baths, the Warrego River, boat cruises, view birds on Bowra Station, fishing, yabbing, sand boarding, bare foot bowls, opal mining, cemetery and historical tours and the Club Boutique Hotel.

Accommodations: Along with hotels, motels, B&B's can all be found in town. There are also caravan parks that offer camping and cabin facilities. There are also farm stays available out of town.

Directions: Cunnamulla can be accessed by rail and air with regular services being offered weekly. There is also a bus route from Brisbane that runs 3 times a week.

What are some other things to know about Dirranbandi

Dirranbandi is considered to be one of the best wool growing areas in Australia. While in town you should visit the Culgoa Flood Plains National Park, noted for its prolific bird life.

Accommodations: There is a hotel, 2 motels, caravan park, hostel, and a budget lodge in town.

Directions: Dirranbandi is located on the banks of the Balonne River, 600 kms West of Brisbane and 70 kms South of St George. There is bus, rail, or air services to the town, you will have to drive.

What are some other things to know about St George

While you are in St George you try to observe local bird life and koalas while on the Balonne river walk or visit the Buckinbah Weir. The self drive heritage trail is available from the Visitor Information Centre, as well as the Self Drive Cotton tour, Unique Egg (carved Emu Egg) and Riversands Winery.

Accomodations: There are hotels, motels, caravan parks, and a hostel in town.

Directions: St George is located 479 kms West of Brisbane and 239 kms North of Moree. This town can be accessed flight or with bus routes from Moree.

While you are in town you should visit the Customs House and Museum, Gunsynd Museum,

Strawberries- Demand for harvest workers is the highest from November to December and February to April.

November- May

Apples/Pears- Demand for harvest workers is the highest from February to April.

December- May

Tomatoes/Capsicum- Demand for harvest workers is the highest from January to April.

What are some other things to know about Stanthorpe

There are a few national parks to visit while in Stanthorpe including Girraween, Sundown, Bald Rock and Boonoo Boonoo. There are more than 50 wineries, an art gallery and the Stanthorpe museum in town as well.

What are some other things to know about Laidley

Laidley has come to be known as “Queensland’s Country Garden”, and has a lot more to offer its residents and visitors than an abundance of fresh fruit and vegetables. While in Laidley you can visit the many markets and stalls, take a stroll through the Laidley Pioneer Village, enjoy a ‘real’ cup of coffee at Das Neumann Haus Museum & Coffee Shoppe, relax at Narda Lagoon Parklands, have a drink at one of the historic pubs/hotels dotted along the Cobb & Co Tourist Drive, enjoy the picturesque views from one of the many lookouts.

Accommodations: There are hotels, motels, farm stays, country retreats, a backpacker lodge, a caravan park, and camping grounds that you can stay at while in Laidley.

What are some other things to know about Gatton

Gatton has plenty to do including great wining, dining and retail therapy. You can try skydiving, or horse riding. There are a lot of attractions to visit in the area including Black Duck Valley 4WD Park, Gatton Pioneer Village, Davson Art Gallery, Historic Pubs/Hotels dotted along the Cobb & Co Tourist Drive, Gatton University, Gatton Equestrian Centre, and Glen Rock Regional Park – just to name a few.

What are some other things to know about Gin Gin

When you're in Gin Gin you need to visit the museum which consists of a delightful old slab barn called 'Euston Barn' along with local memorabilia. A ten minute drive north of Gin Gin is the Lake Monduran recreation area with a walking trail and fantastic fishing. To the West of Gin Gin on the road to Mount Perry is the Boolboonda Tunnel – the longest unsupported man made tunnel in Australia and Gin Gin Regional Court House Gallery.

Accommodations: There are many hotels, motels, caravan parks, and hostels in town.

Directions: Gin Gin is about 45 minutes west of Bundaberg. Buses travel daily to Gin Gin from Brisbane and Bundaberg.

May, June + October- December

Melons- Demand for harvest workers is the highest from October to December.

April- August

Avocados- Demand for harvest workers is steady for the whole period.

April- December

Tomatoes- Demand for harvest workers is high for the whole period except in September when it dips a little before becoming high again for the rest of the year.

December- February
